

### **BACKGROUNDER**

Finding a solution to the vexatious Cauvery dispute has been a challenge to even the collective wisdom of veteran politicians, seasoned policy makers, experts and farmers. It has even tested the strength of India's federal structure at times. After bickering among riparian constituents of the Cauvery basin for over a century and exhausting all avenues, the judiciary, finally, had to do the task of apportioning the quantum of water for each riparian party. This book, *Cauvery: A Long-winded Dispute*, gives an account of how the dispute evolved over the years, especially after the 1924 Agreement between the Madras Presidency and the Princely State of Mysore. It also drives home the point that the last word has not yet been said on the issue. Apart from the subject of water sharing, the work, authored by T. Ramakrishnan, senior associate editor with *The Hindu* who has been writing on the subject for more than 30 years, discusses the challenges facing the river on various fronts, including the environment.
